# Sessional Review 2023-2024

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INTRODUCTION

The **Fourth Session** of the 12<sup>th</sup> Parliament began on **Monday September 11, 2023** by Proclamation [Legal Notice 267 of 2023] and prorogued on **Tuesday September 10, 2024** by Proclamation of Her Excellency [Legal Notice 163 of 2024].

This report outlines the business of the Parliament of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago which was conducted during the Fourth Session of the Twelfth Parliament.

BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES (HOR)

SITTINGS

A total of one hundred and sixty-nine (169) hours and forty-seven (47) minutes were spent debating in the Chamber of the House of Representatives (HOR).

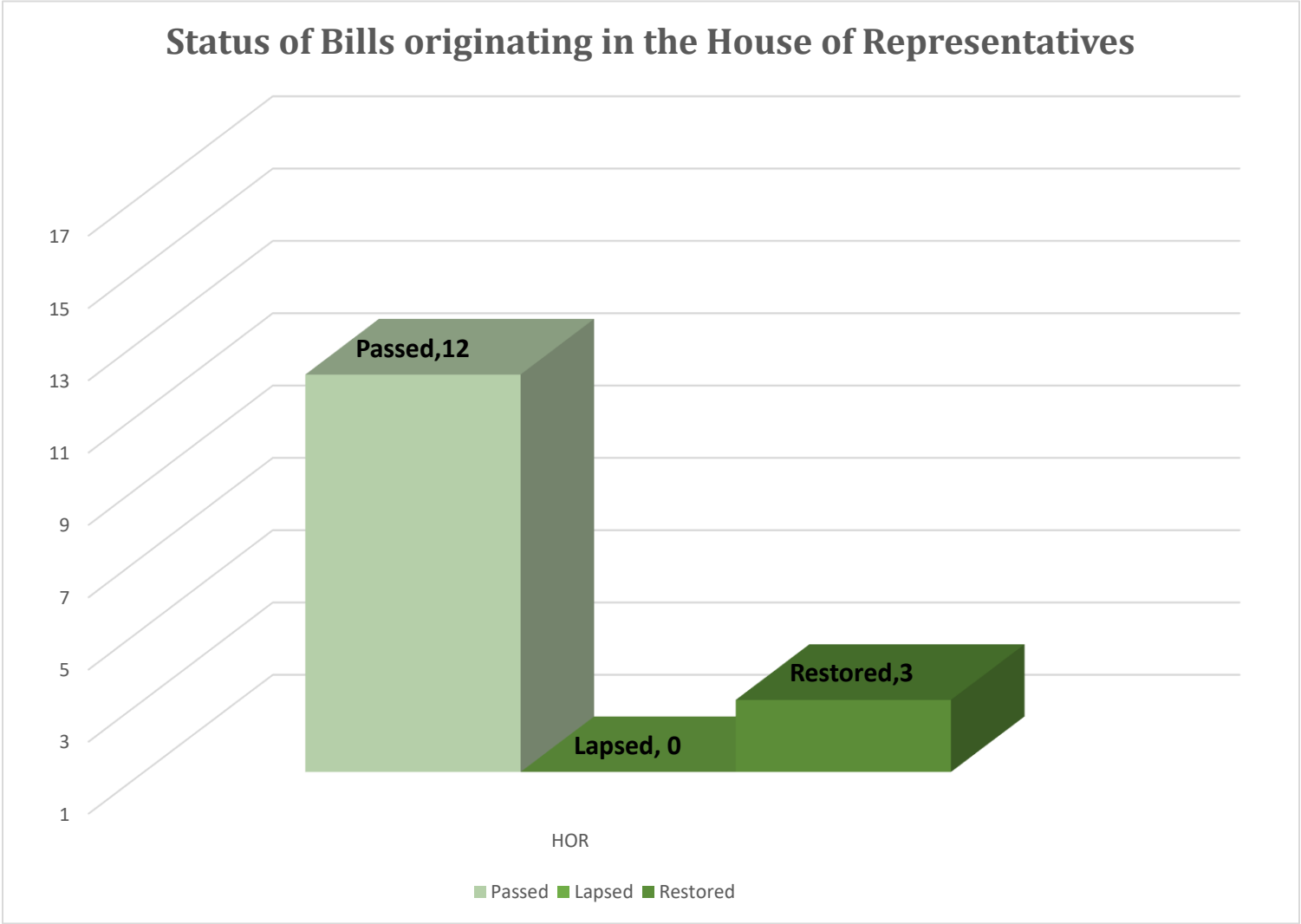

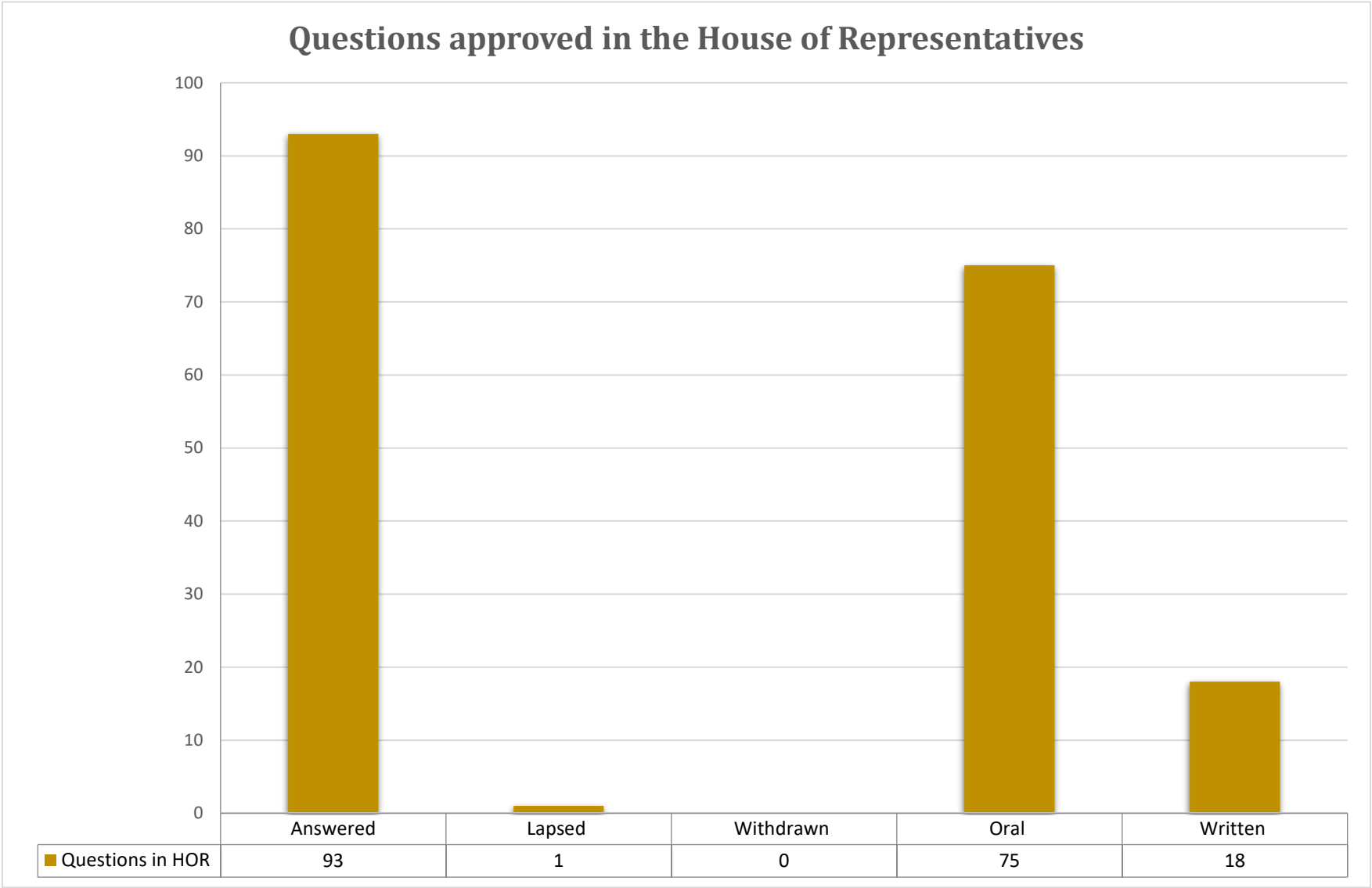

## DEFINITE MATTERS OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

Standing Order 17 of the House of Representatives, guided by Westminster Parliamentary Practice speaks to Definite Matters of Urgent Public Importance. For a matter to qualify for debate, it must meet all three (3) substantive criteria as follows:

**1. Definite:**

- the matter must not only be specific, but its facts must be settled; and
- the matter, event or issue must be certain, not hypothetical; or even worse, presumptive.

**2. Urgent:**

- the nature of the crisis or emergency must demand the prompt attention of the House;
- the matter must be exceedingly urgent, that is, it arose suddenly, is of a pressing nature, and has potentially serious consequences; and
- a matter that has been ongoing for some time will not qualify, such as crime, foreign exchange shortages or unemployment. Although these matters are important, they do not qualify under Standing Order 17;
- the urgency should be such that the matter allows no delay and for which a motion or a resolution with proper notice will be too late. Consequently, a matter that could have been raised at a previous sitting and was not so raised, cannot satisfy the rule; and
- a matter which can be discussed in the ordinary course of business, should not cause the House to set aside its prearranged business.

**3. Public Importance:**

- the matter affects the entire country and its urgency and gravity justifies it.

During the session, a total of two (2) definite matters of urgent public importance were filed, one (1) matter qualified to be raised and the other did not qualify.

### *Statutory Instruments Committee*

The Statutory Instruments Committee is established by Standing Order 89 of the House of Representatives. Its mandate is set out in Standing Order 93(1) which states that, “The Statutory Instruments Committee shall consider Statutory Instruments that are subject to the negative resolution. It shall have the duty, *inter alia*, of bringing to the attention of the House any such instrument –

- a) which involves the expenditure of public moneys or which imposes or fixes fees for licenses or for services;
- b) which cannot be challenged in the Courts on the ground that it is *ultra vires*, or is only temporarily so challengeable;
- c) the making of which appears to constitute an unusual or unexpected use of the powers conferred by the law under which it was made;
- d) which purports to have retroactive or retrospective effect although the law under which it was made does not in terms give the maker of the instrument such a power;
- e) the publication or the laying before the House of which, appears to have been unduly delayed;
- f) in respect of which there has been unjustifiable delay in notifying the Speaker that the instrument had come into operation before it was laid before the House; or
- g) the purport or form of which appears to require elucidation.

Standing Order 93(2) states that “The Statutory Instruments Committee shall not consider or report on the merits or policy of any such instrument.”

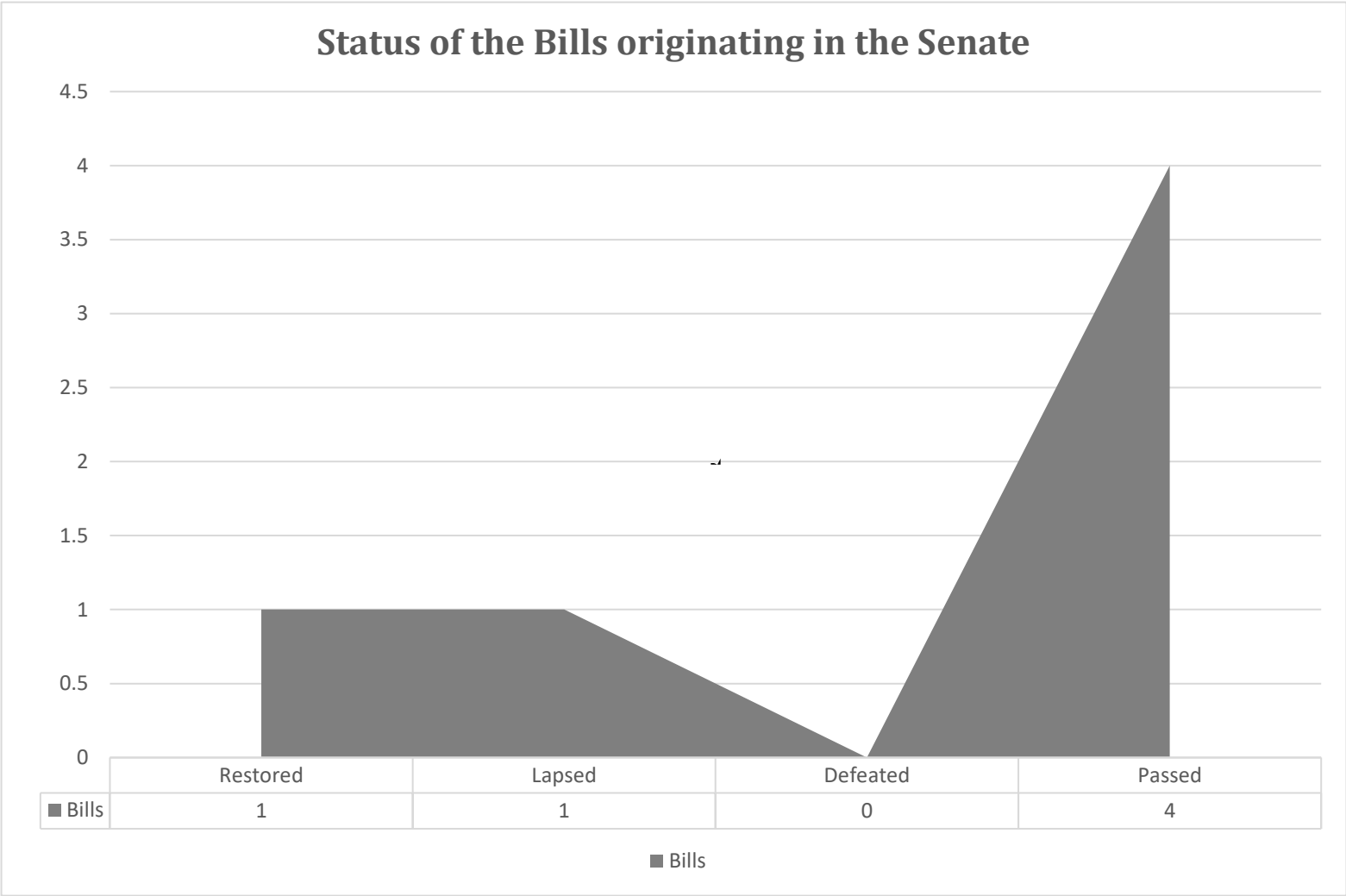

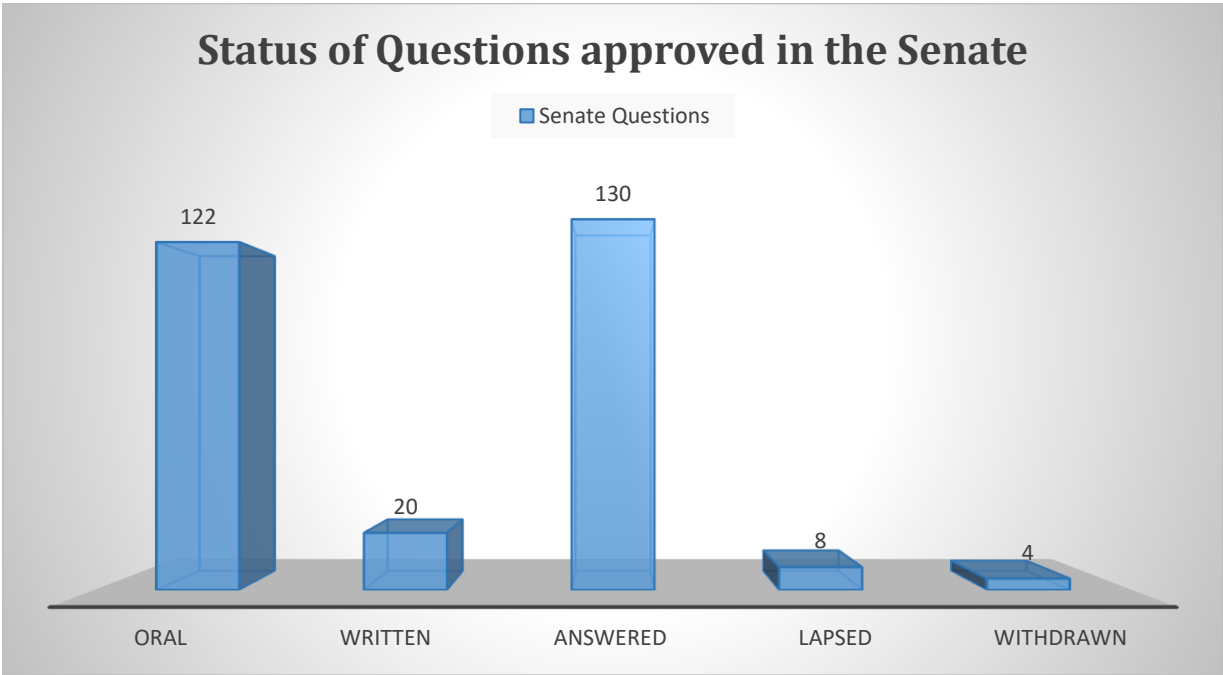

## DEFINITE MATTERS OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

Standing Order 16 of the Senate, guided by Westminster Parliamentary Practice, speaks to Definite Matters of Urgent Public Importance. For a matter to be debated, the following three (3) substantive criteria must be met:

1. **Definite:**

- the matter must not only be specific, but its facts must be settled; and
- the matter, event or issue must be certain, not hypothetical; or even worse presumptive.

2. **Urgent:**

- the nature of the crisis or emergency must demand the prompt attention of the House;
- the matter must be exceedingly urgent, that is, it arose suddenly, is of a pressing nature, and has potentially serious consequences; and
- a matter that has been ongoing for some time will not qualify, such as crime, foreign exchange shortages or unemployment. Although these matters are important, they do not qualify under Standing Order 16;
- the urgency should be such that the matter allows no delay and for which a motion or a resolution with proper notice will be too late. Consequently, a matter that could have been raised at a previous sitting and was not so raised, cannot satisfy the rule; and
- a matter which can be discussed in the ordinary course of business, should not cause the House to set aside its prearranged business.

3. **Public Importance:**

- the matter affects the entire country and its urgency and gravity justifies it.

One (1) matter was filed under Standing Order 16 as a definite matter of urgent public importance, however it did not qualify to be raised.

- 3) In addition to the Joint Select Committees at (2) above, the following Joint Select Committees are hereby established:
  - (a) Public Administration and Appropriations Committee;
  - (b) Parliamentary Broadcasting Committee; and
  - (c) Committee on Government Assurances.

### DEPARTMENTAL JOINT SELECT COMMITTEES

**The Departmental Committees are as follows:**

- 1) National Security;
- 2) Energy Affairs;
- 3) Foreign Affairs;
- 4) Human Rights, Equality and Diversity;

and the following omnibus Committees:

- 5) Finance and Legal Affairs (to include Finance, Planning, Trade, Tobago Affairs, OPM, Attorney General, Justice and Legal Affairs);
- 6) Land and Physical Infrastructure (to include Land, Agriculture, Marine Resources, Housing, Public Utilities, Transport and Works);
- 7) Social Services and Public Administration (to include Education, Health, Gender, Tourism, Public Administration, Labour, Culture, Community Development and other Social Services);
- 8) Local Authorities, Service Commissions and Statutory Authorities (including the THA); and
- 9) State Enterprises.

## MANDATE

Section 66A (1) (ii) of the Constitution states *inter alia*:

“...Parliament may resolve not being later than three months thereafter, appoint *Joint Select Committees*, to inquire into and report to both Houses of Parliament in respect of –

- (A) *Government Ministries*
- (B) *Municipal Corporations;*
- (C) *Statutory Authorities;*
- (D) *Enterprises owned or controlled by or on behalf of the State or which received funding from the State of more than two third of its total income in any one year; and*
- (E) *Service Commissions, in relation to their administration, the manner of the exercise of their powers, their methods of functioning and any criteria adopted by them in the exercise of their powers and functions.”*

FINANCIAL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE (PAC)

Section 119(1) of the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago provides for the establishment of the PAC. The PAC examines reports of the Auditor General on the various Accounts of Government Ministries and Agencies. The PAC is assisted by the Auditor General and has powers to send for persons, papers, and records.

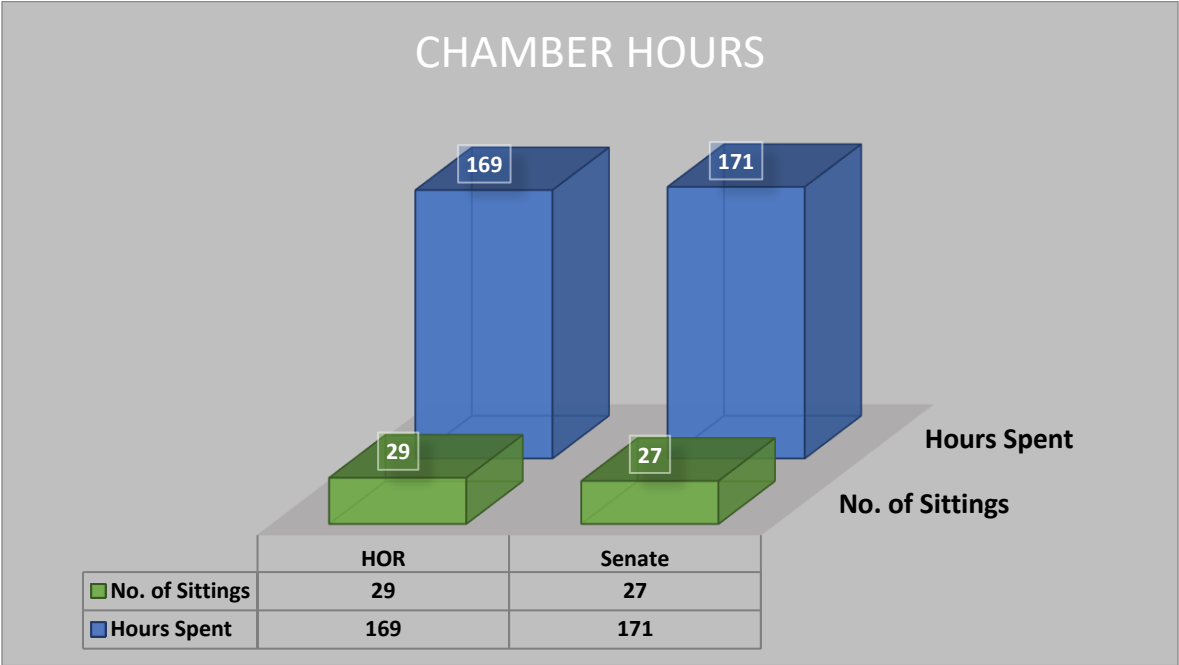


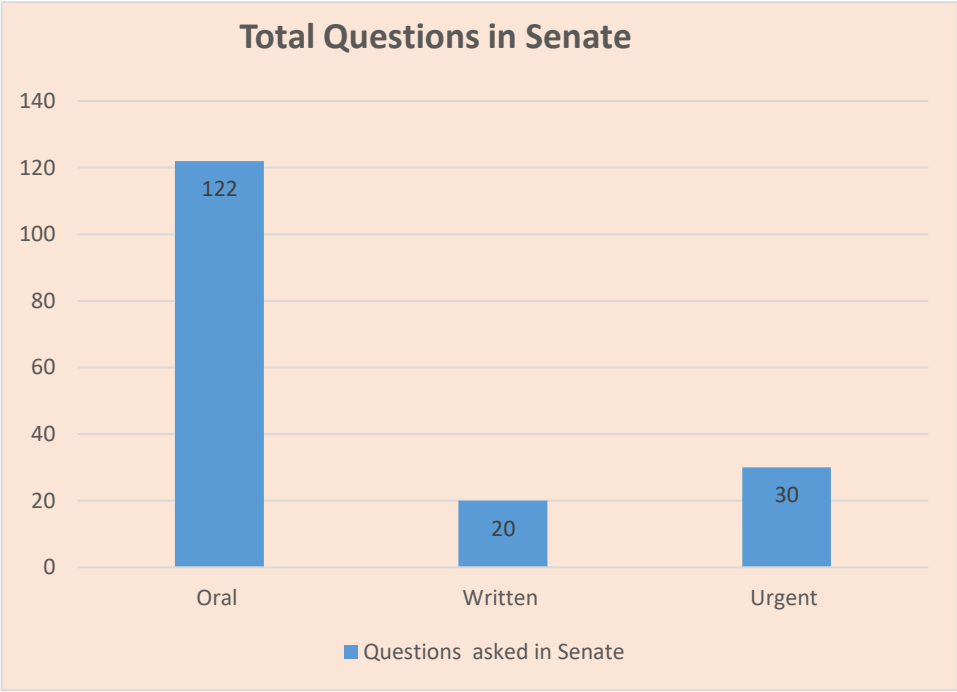
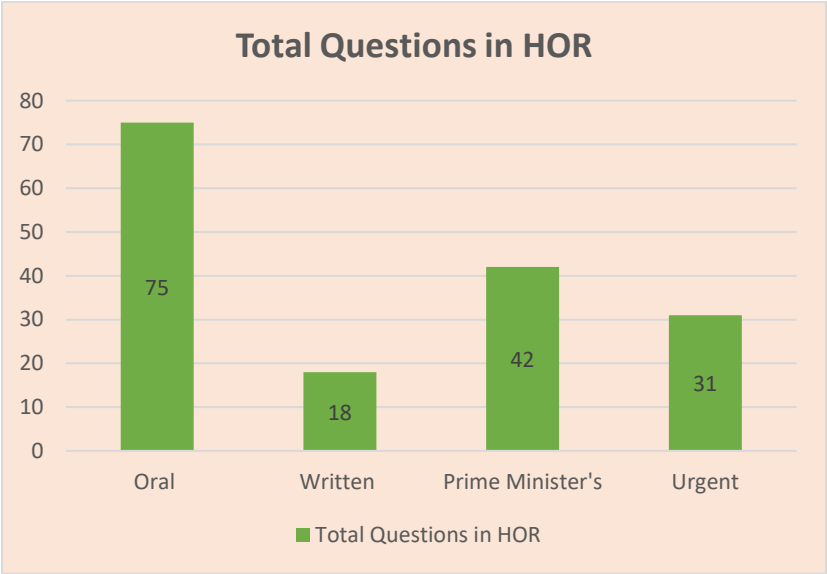

## APPENDIX IV

### POINTS OF INTEREST

- **Procedural Issues re: Statutory Instruments**

1. ***Suspension of Standing Order 78(2) in relation to calculating the Prescribed Period for the consideration of Statutory Instruments***

The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Property (Exemption) (Financing Services) Order, 2023 was published in the Gazette on September 08, 2023. On September 27, 2023, a Senator filed a Motion to annul the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Property (Exemption) (Financing Services) Order, 2023. The Motion stood on the Order Paper to be debated at the earliest occasion, pursuant to Standing Order 78(4).

In accordance with Standing Order 112(1), the Leader of Government Business in the Senate moved a Motion for the suspension of Standing Order 78(2) in relation to the calculating of time for Statutory Instruments, where the prescribed period fell within the period of the parliamentary budgetary process (October 02 – 25, 2023). The Senate agreed to said Motion and the calculating of time for Statutory Instruments, where the prescribed period fell within the period of the parliamentary budgetary process (October 02 – 25, 2023) was suspended.

Additionally, the Senator who filed the abovementioned Motion proceeded on leave from the jurisdiction for the period October 30 to November 09, 2023. As a result, another Senator, duly authorised by that Senator, moved the Motion on November 07, 2023. The Motion to negative the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Property (Exemption) (Financing Services) Order, 2023 was subsequently debated and not carried on November 07, 2023.

2. ***Removal of an Annulment Motion from the Senate Order Paper***

On April 18, 2024, a Senator filed a Motion to negative the Public Procurement (Simplified Procurement) Regulations, 2024. The Motion stood on the Order Paper to be debated at the earliest occasion, pursuant to Standing Order 78(4).

The Senator who filed the Motion then proceeded on leave from the jurisdiction for the period May 01 – 17, 2024. Additionally, the Prescribed Period for the consideration of statutory instruments subject to negative resolution of Parliament, in accordance with Standing Order 78(2), expired on May 16, 2024.

As a result, the abovementioned Motion was removed from the Senate Order Paper.

- **Resolution re: Extension of period of time under sections 24(1) and 25(1) of the Exchequer and Audit Act Chap. 69:01**

The Minister of Finance is responsible for the control and management of the financial affairs of the country. In this regard, the Ministry of Finance is responsible for providing proper accounting of the financial position of Trinidad and Tobago to Parliament each year via the production of statements on the country's Public Accounts.

On April 24, 2024<sup>13</sup>, the Report of the Auditor General on the Public Accounts of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago for the financial year 2023 (the Report) was submitted to the Speaker, the President of the Senate and the Minister of Finance in accordance with Section 116 of the Constitution of Trinidad and Tobago and Section 25 of the Exchequer and Audit Act, Chap. 69:01.

The Report was placed on the Order Papers to be laid in the House of Representatives and in the Senate by the Clerks on April 26 and 29, 2024 respectively. However, the Report was not laid by the Minister of Finance. Alternatively, a Resolution pursuant to sections 24(1) and 25(1) of the Exchequer and Audit Act was passed in the House of Representatives and in the Senate on April 26 and 29, 2024 respectively. The Resolution extended the period for the Ministry of Finance to submit the 2023 Public Accounts to the Auditor General from January 31, 2024 to May 31, 2024. The Resolution also extended the period for the Auditor General to examine and report on the 2023 Public Accounts to August 31, 2024.

A resolution pursuant to sections 24(1) and 25(1) of the Exchequer and Audit Act to extend the period for the Ministry of Finance to submit the Public Accounts to the Auditor General and the period for the Auditor General to examine and report on the Public Accounts has never been considered and passed in the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago.

The Report was subsequently laid in the House of Representatives on May 24, 2024. A Special Report was commissioned to follow-up on actions of the Ministry of Finance which were identified and reported on in said Special Report. The Special Report was laid in the House of Representatives on September 09, 2024.
