# **REPORT**

#### RECOMMENDATION

- 7. Your Committee therefore recommends the resumption of proceedings on the **Shipping Bill, 2020** in the Fourth Session, Twelfth Parliament.
- 8. Your Committee also asks that the House take note of the work achieved and the progress made thus far, and that a Committee be appointed in the Fourth Session to continue work on the Bill and adopt as part of its records, all work completed to date.
