## Ministerial Response to:

The Recommendation 4.12 outlined on page forty (40) of above-mentioned Committee's Report:

4.12. The Committee recommends that the Ministry of Education permits both parents (whether or not the parent registered the child at the school) to access their child's educational records, subject to the parent presenting valid documents verifying their parental status and custodial rights to the child.
