Due to the high cost of acquisition and maintenance, as well as the fact that dinghies have been shown to be effective for shallow water rescues for civilian use, the MRDLG is not interested in purchasing amphibious vehicles at this time. The Fire Service and Coast Guard of Trinidad and
			Tobago are professional first responders in charge of search and rescue, including shallow and deep-water rescues.
