Recommendations following the public hearing on 27th January, 2012

- Improvements to the Public Outreach Programmes-
 - Utilization of government information programmes as a broad stroke in keeping the nation abreast of the update and programmes of the Teaching Service Commission (TSC).

The recommendation will be examined by the TSC

• Development of a website as a method to directly receive complaints.

The recommendation will be examined by the TSC

• Implementation of benchmarks for comparative analysis for comparing information between teachers in board assisted schools and government schools.

The recommendation will be examined by the TSC

• Implementation of a vetting process interjected into the selection process to unearth alcoholics, drug users, and child abusers, to prevent unacceptable persons from joining the Teaching Service.

The TSC intends to widen the selection process to include activities, such as psychometric testing, with a view to identifying unacceptable persons and increasing the success factor for high performing teachers. Steps are therefore being taken to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) for consultancy services in connection with the matter.
