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# **INTRODUCTION**

The **Fourth Session** of the 11<sup>th</sup> Parliament began on **Friday 28<sup>th</sup> September, 2018** by Proclamation [Legal Notice 131 of 2018] and prorogued on **September 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019** by Proclamation of Her Excellency [Legal Notice 298 of 2019].

This Report outlines the Business conducted by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago during this Fourth Session of the Eleventh Parliament.



- (g) the purport or form of which appears to require elucidation.
- (2) The Statutory Instruments Committee shall not consider or report on the merits or policy of any such instrument.




This graph illustrates the number of questions filed and answered in both houses during the Fourth Session of the Eleventh Parliament.




